

1. Imperial War Museum

Imperial War Museums is the world's leading museum of war and conflict. Founded while the First World War was still raging, it gives voice to the extraordinary experiences of ordinary people forced to live their lives in a world torn apart by conflict.

2. Southwark Cathedral

Southwark Cathedral or The Cathedral and Collegiate Church of St Saviour and St Mary Overie is the name of the Anglican cathedral built on the south bank of the Thames in Southwark, London. The church building, which is kept in the Gothic style, essentially dates from the period from 1220 to 1420.

3. Tower Bridge

This amazing Bridge is next to the Tower of London. It is 60 metres long and opens up when tall ships are passing.

5. St. Paul's Cathedral

St. Paul's Cathedral is an episcopal

church in London. It is located in the City of London district about 300 meters north of the Thames and is the seat of the Bishop of the Diocese of London, the Church of England. St. Paul's Cathedral is one of the largest in the world.

6. British Museum

The British Museum in London is one of the largest and most important museums of cultural history in the world. The Natural History Museum was once part of the British Museum and has been independent since 1963.

7. Whitehall

Whitehall is a street in London in the government district of Westminster. About two thirds of the route from Trafalgar Square to Parliament Square is called Whitehall, the remaining third is called Parliament Street. Both streets together are barely a mile long.

8. Houses of Parliament

The Palace of Westminster, "Westminster Palast" in German, is the seat of the British Parliament in London, which consists of the House of Commons and the House of Lords.

9. Buckingham Palace

Buckingham Palace is the official residence of the British monarch

in London. The building in the City of Westminster district serves not only as a residence for Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Philip but also for official state events.

10. Westminster Cathedral

Westminster Cathedral in London is the cathedral church of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Westminster and the main Catholic church for England and Wales.
